

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

COST INCLUDES all lodge accommodations in double rooms with private bath, all meals in Honduras, land transportation and airport transfers, hotel taxes and tips except those to drivers or local guides.

COST IS BASED ON a minimum group of 5 passengers. Cost is further based on today's (October 2009's) cost quotations and although unlikely, is subject to change according to fluctuations in international monetary exchange rates and circumstances beyond our control.

COST DOES NOT INCLUDE international air fare from the U.S. to San Pedro Sula Airport (SAP), or items not specifically covered in the itinerary, single room supplements, passport or tourist card fees, airport departure tax, insurance, alcoholic beverages, soft drinks, bottled water, laundry, telephone calls, cables, or any other expenses of a personal nature.

RESERVATIONS AND FINAL PAYMENT: A deposit of \$500 per person is necessary as soon as possible in order to confirm booking. Final payment is due not later than 90 days prior to departure, as will be indicated on your receipt for deposit.

CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS: Full refunds will be made up to 90 days prior to departure, upon receipt of written cancellation. After that date, refunds will be based on moneys recovered by the tour operator subject to the rules and regulations of the hotels and local purveyors of services involved. No refunds can be made for any services not used for less than two days or for occasional sightseeing or meals not taken. Refunds will be made solely on residual values received from purveyors of services.

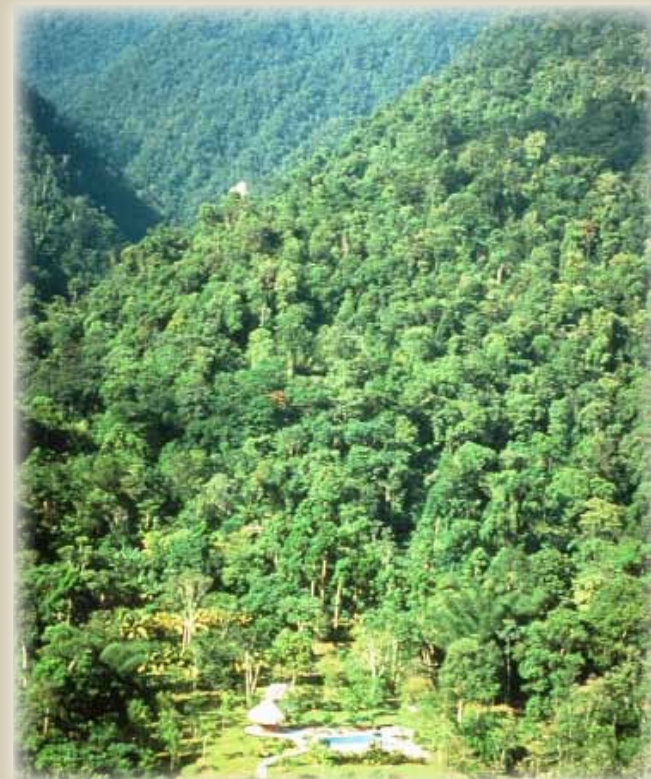

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Pico Bonito National Park

Honduras is certainly on the road-less-traveled both in terms of visitors to Central America as well as Lepidoptera research in the tropics. However, it is home to some of the most pristine national parks, towering peaks and lush tropical lowland and montane rainforest left in Central America, making this a highly desirable place to explore. This trip to Honduras will focus on Pico Bonito National Park, an area of unspoiled primary forest that covers over 1000 square kilometers of lowland and montane rainforest with an elevation range of 81m - 2369m. Located near the northern coastline, this national park has an equally outstanding lodge and research station that provides exclusive access into the rich jungle of the interior. A variety of trails give access to great areas of the lowland rainforest as well as access into the mid-montane forest.

Accommodations:

The Lodge at Pico Bonito is keenly interested in initiating scientific research and education through expeditions and teaching programs like this one, which will afford us an unprecedented look at the deep interior of Pico Bonito National Park. Lodging during the expedition will be modestly comfortable and meals will be basic but similar to that found at other research stations in Central America. However, the main dining room of the lodge offers a wide assortment of epicurean delights, and arrangements can be made ahead of time if you wish to order from the menu.



Trip Schedule:

Upon arriving at San Pedro Sula (SAP) International Airport around mid-day on June 24th, we will depart as a group for the Pico Bonito Research Station, having time for some immediate exploration and plenty of time to set up night collecting gear. The lodge has excellent access to the forest, making it ideal for

photographing and collecting. Having a large private forest as well as direct trails into the park, this is an extraordinary base of operations. Days will be yours to explore, photograph and collect on your own. Throughout the course of the trip, your expedition leaders will brief you on optional day trips for more typical sight-seeing activities, such as snorkeling at Roatan,

wildlife watching in mangrove estuaries, and extended guided hikes to even more remote areas of the park. Birders will also be in for a treat as species often regarded as rare elsewhere are found with relative ease around the lodge and in the forest. We will depart the lodge for the airport again on July 2nd.
